(Berliner Philharmoniker, 2021– World Premiere: *Keyframes for a Hippogriff* by Olga Neuwirth) Few countertenors have pushed the boundaries of repertoire and sound more than Andrew Watts. A dramatic voice unlike any other and extraordinary stage craft and presence make him a unique performer not only of parts traditionally associated with the voice type, but also a pioneer of 20th and 21st century repertoire. He is associated particularly with parts like Edgar in Reiman's Lear, which he performed Staatsoper at Hamburg, Opéra national de Paris, Musicale Maggio Fiorentino, Staatsoper Hannover, Bayerische Staatsoper Munich and Teatro Real Madrid.

As well as singing core roles of the countertenor repertoire such as Ottone Agrippina (Teatro Nacional de São Carlos, Lisbon), Athamas Semele (Oper Graz) and Arsamene Xerxes (English National Opera), **Oberon** A Midsummer's Night Dream and Prince Go-Go (Komische Oper Berlin, ENO, Oper Graz) and such less frequently done by countertenors like Baba the Turk The Rake's (Festival Progress d'Aix-en-Provence, Dutch National Opera, Stanislavsky Theatre, Moscow) and Orlofsky Die Fledermaus (Oper Graz), he has performed over 60 world premieres.

Creating roles specifically written for him, Andrew has also performed at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden, Glyndebourne Festival, La Scala, La Fenice, Staatsoper Berlin, Opera de Lyon, with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and at the Salzburg, Bregenz, Lucerne, Aldeburgh and Edinburgh International Festivals as well as the Ruhrtriennale and the BBC Proms, and premiered works by Harrison Birtwistle (The Minotaur; Gawain; The Last Supper), Olga Neuwirth (Bählamms Fest; Lost Highway; The Outcast; Keyframes for a Hippogriff), Unsuk Chin (Alice in Wonderland), Nuñez (Märchen), Guarnieri (Medea), Raymond Yiu (The Original Chinese Conjuror), Michael Finnissey (Thérèse Raquin), Judith Weir (Miss Fortune), Torsten Rasch (The Duchess of Malfi), Tansy Davies (Between Worlds) and Elena Langer (Figaro Gets A Divorce).

Recent and upcoming highlights include debuts with the New York Philharmonic (Keyframes for a Hippogriff) and with the Wiener Staatsoper as Prince Go-Go in a new production of Le grand macabre, returns to Festival Présences and to the Bayerische Staatsoper **Orlofsky** in Barrie Kosky's *Die* Fledermaus, world and the Dusapin's premieres of Pascal Antigone (Philharmonie de Paris) and Olga Neuwirth's Monster's Paradise (Staatsoper Hamburg and Opernhaus Zürich)

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
